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Report on the 12th General Assembly meeting Jnana-Deepa Vidyapeeth, Pune, India November 1-4, 2011

The Conference of Catholic Theological Institutions (COCTI) held its 12th triannual General Assembly on November 1-4 at Jnana-Deepa Vidyapeeth, Pontifical Institute of Philosophy ad Religion, Ramwadi, Pune, India.

The theme of the meeting was "Doing Theology in the Context of Religious, Cultural and Ideological Pluralism".

Participants were greeted on the university campus by an exceptionally warm welcome by its President, Job Kozhamthadam, by the Faculty of Theology and its President Thomas Kuriacose, and by the organization committee presided by Noël Shet, together with Sister Rekha Chennattu, John Karuvelil and their teams, the priests and seminarists on the campus.

The General Assembly was attended by forty-two participants coming from twenty-two countries: Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Columbia, the Republic of Congo, the Czech Republic, Ecuador, France, Germany, Hungary, India, Italy, Ivory Coast, Spain, Kenya, Lebanon, Mexico, the Philippines, Poland, and the United States. The participants worked together in three successive workshops under the guidance of President Philippe Bordeyne, together with Vice-President Alexander P. Zatyrka Pacheco, counsellors Léonard Santedi (Africa), and Marc Pelchat (North America). Secretary João Marques Eleuterio was not able to make the trip. Guy Réal-Thivierge, IFCU General Secretary, and Joao Vila-Chã, COMIUCAP President, were prevented at the last minute to come to Pune because they could not get a visa in time.



We have celebrated the memory of the late P. Arockiadoss, the last Dean of Pune's Faculty of Theology who had accepted to welcome this 12th General Assembly and passed away a few months after the previous one. Mgr Thomas Dabre, Bishop of Pune, opened the General Assembly during which President Philippe Bordeyne made his Moral Report.

Twenty-five communications were communicated to the participants divided in three workshops, together with a paper on promoting Christian libraries and their networks. You will find the list of these communications annexed to this report. They will also be available on COCTI internet site in May 2012.

The Assembly was rythmed by an Indian-style Mass, a film on the subcontinent, a cultural show and a banquet which together brought everyone into the heart of Indian civilization. Each participant received a gilded copper picture of Nataraja as a souvenir of this memorable stay. Finally, a three-day trip to Janta and Ellora sanctuaries gave some of the participants the opportunity to familiarize themselves with India's religious and artistic culture.

Thanks to the large number of institutions represented, this 12th General Assembly made it possible to put to the record the first stage of the refoundation of our professional association of Deans and Heads of Theological Catholic Institutions, a refoundation that took place in Paris in January 2008. COCTI is one of IFCU nine sectorial groups, together with that of philosophy (COMIUCAP), education (ACISE), sciences and technologies, psychology (FIUCUP), social sciences, family (REDIF), medicine (AIFMC) and political sciences.

A new Executive Board was unanimously elected, comprising of:

- Thierry-Marie Courau, President (and delegate for Europe)
- Yvon Christian Elenga, Vice-President (and delegate for Africa)
- Thomas Kuriacose (delegate for Asia-Oceania)
- Marc Pelchat (delegate for North America)
- Herman Rodríguez Osorio (delegate for South America)

The mandate of the Board members will run until the next General Assembly.

Participants voted to hold COCTI 13th General Assembly in 2014 in the Catholic University of Eastern Africa (CUEA), Nairobi, Kenya, a choice which was verbally accepted by this university's dean.



Some themes were chosen for the forthcoming three years:

1/ expand COCTI membership

- identify potential members
- organize the promotion of the association

2/ develop administration and management tools

- learn how to organize common projects
- together, seek funding from international, European and francophone organizations

3/ improve our university ability and expertise by knowing and helping each other

- promote exchanging ideas on our organizations, our new teaching projects
- encourage inviting professors and the exchange of students between faculties
- promote the development of, and on-line access to a working network of libraries
- consider ways of improving our governance processes and pedagogical methods
- assume our responsibility as theologians in the dialogue with the secular world
- make ourselves better known in Rome

Each regional organization, under the authority of its delegate, should plan to have a 2-3 days interim assembly in 2013 to maintain and develop the network of catholic theological institutes and prepare the 2014 General Assembly. COCTI Executive Board will meet sometime before Fall 2012 to make a list of suggestions for this General Assembly.
